Gamble Rogers Middle School is one of seven middle schools in the St. Johns County School District in northeast Florida. The district of over 40,000 students has been the highest rated public school system in the state of Florida for over ten years receiving an A grade each year from the state Department of Education. Our school has an enrollment of 917 students in grades 6 - 8. Our attendance zone is the largest in the district and encompasses the entire southern half of our county from the St. Johns River to the Atlantic Ocean. Our students reside in rural agricultural, suburban or beachfront communities. The state identifies our ethnicity as approximately 80% white, 9% African-American, and 8% Hispanic/Latino. We are a Title One school with a free and reduced lunch percentage of 46%.

The signature programs and special features of our school include AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination), WEB (Where Everyone Belongs)(student leadership course) and National Junior Honor Society. There are many layers of support we provide students through our PLC (Professional Learning Community) School of Distinction, co-teach model for our exceptional education students and other struggling students, AVID tutoring support, and "Stingray Success" remediation and enrichment twice a week.

We have a robust selection of elective courses in the areas of agri-science, drama, fine arts, music and band, STEM, Spanish, computer & technology, and physical education. We also have many clubs.

We also have a very collaborative relationship with our main public library branch nearby.
