## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

He also reported that the District has a Grant dollars for schools that have subgroups in their school population who need extra help. He said that these funds had been used to hire Learning Logics out of Jupiter to visit the schools in SJC. The team from Learning Logics came out and visited GRMS and provided a report. They prioritized the needs and made recommendations for implementation. There is a plan to utilize the summer break to get teachers together to make plans for next year, primarily in Math and ELA. Two of the recommendations were to implement more small group instruction and to use strategies that kids enjoy to make them excited to learn using critical thinking and higher order thinking skills.

Lisa Calvert from the Southeast Branch of the SJC Public Library informed the group that there are Teen Cooking Classes, a Middle School Book Club and other programs in place for all students. There is also a new interface being used by the Library which includes a link for patrons to use to trace their ancestry,
