# Parent and Family Engagement Mission Statement:

Gamble Rogers will develop a partnership with parents, families, and students to increase involvement in the common goal of improving academic achievement.

#### Involvement of Parents and Building Capacity:

Our school will involve parents in the making and improvement of Title 1 programs through outreach to monthly PTO and SAC meetings, monthly newsletters that highlight curriculum, an annual Parent Night, quarterly Lunch and Learn opportunities, an annual Literacy Night, and our Fall Arts Festival. We will also be inviting parents to Data and Donuts meetings after each of the FAST assessment periods to dive into how their children are evaluated on state assessments. We are currently coordinating a Local History night at the suggestion of several parents from our latest SAC meeting (9/21/23).

#### Coordination and Integration:

Our school will coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities that teach parents how to help their children by integrating at-home vocabulary and reading activities to assist parents with boosting skills for their children. Our SAC members suggested that this be integrated into our weekly Stingray newsletter for ease of use and to prevent too many messages coming home to parents.

## Annual Parent Meeting:

Our school will host an Annual Parent Meeting on October 5, 2023. We will offer this meeting during a Curriculum Night to further boost attendance. We will review the Title 1 program's purpose, Adequate Yearly Progress, school choice, and the rights of parents.

#### Flexible Parent Meetings:

Gamble will offer flexible meetings to support parental involvement. Our plan is to offer "Donuts & Data" morning meetings to share information about the

academic assessments we use to measure student progress, as well as the proficiency levels students are expected to obtain. We also have a few "Lunch and Learn" opportunities for parents to come and learn more about the ELA and Math curriculums. We'd like to spotlight reading as well with a "Reading Night" to let parents find out about what digital and print resources we have available to students and families. Our SAC parents also suggested that we offer Zoom meetings during these opportunities for parents that would like to participate from work or home.

## Staff Development:

Our professional development activities this year will include strategies to reach out to parents in a positive, meaningful way. Incorporating simple things, like making 3 positive phone calls every Wednesday, are easy to do but often overlooked for their simplicity. We are also expanding our PBiS program to include more recognition of positive behavior. Our student and teacher of the week winners go out to parents in our newsletter and by text. These programs spotlight one student from each grade level with a narrative of why they were nominated, with pictures being posted around our school and digitally to parents. We are the proud owners of a new digital noticeboard in the front of the parent pick-up line that shares the names of these winners as well. Staff are continually trained with new PBiS incentives and rewards that help us celebrate our students. We receive feedback from both families and students about the excitement these events drum up.

## **Communication:**

Communication to families about events and programs comes home primarily through our weekly newsletter. This is emailed and texted to parents every Sunday evening. We also use the telephone alert system to communicate important dates such as our FAST testing windows. Parents can also come in for face-to-face meetings with staff for updates about their child's academic performance. HAC and Schoology are an instant way that parents can keep up-to-date with their child's daily assignments as our teachers are expected to post lesson outlines and assignments each week. Some even upload copies of classwork/notes/homework for children and families to access from home in case of absences. Schoology is an easy way for parents and students to ask questions or leave comments about the curriculum by using their message board.

## Accessibility:

We are lucky enough to have several staff members that are bilingual. We enlist their help when needed to help us better connect with parents with limited English proficiency. We also have at least one of our wonderful interpreters at events for families of the deaf/hard of hearing. Our PowerPoint presentations are subtitled to help with this as well.

#### **Barriers**:

One of the barriers we have seen since Covid has been simply a hesitancy to attend large events. Hopefully with our growing normalcy, families will feel comfortable visiting our school. Coming up with meaningful, interesting events is our path back. Advertising these events in print, digital, and word-of-mouth will be vital to making this a success. If we can get kids excited and talking about these events to their families, then hopefully we can draw them in. Making sure we have resources for families with special needs must also be a priority when we think about parking, interpreters, and bilingual support. The last barrier we need to work to overcome is a sense of complacency. Taking suggestions from SAC members has helped us plan for diverse events such as a Local History Night. We've never offered something like this before, so hopefully this is just the beginning of a year of firsts.
