
# The AVID elective is:

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# The AVID elective develops:

- Readers, writers, and critical thinkers
- Speaking & social skills
- Deep content knowledge
- Habits, skills, and behaviors important for success in college, career, and life

#### What the AVID Elective is NOT:

Study hall, one-on-one student help, or a place for students to regularly complete homework or make-up work

#### All about tutorials:

Tutorials take place twice weekly in the AVID elective classroom with a student-tutor ratio of 7:1. Students come prepared with a tutorial request form (TRF) completed as homework in order to take part in the tutori-



Steps in the Tutorial Process:

## Before the tutorial:

Students take notes in academic classes & complete tutorial request form (TRF).

## **During the tutorial:**

Students are put into groups. Each student presents their Point of Confusion while group members ask questions and take notes.

## After the tutorial:

Students complete their reflection and turn in TRF for grading. Students take TRF back to academic classes to verify learning.
